JOB DESCRIPTION

Role overview:

To contribute to the planning and delivery of the DSMF drugs education programmes.

Key areas of work:

1. Deliver DSMF drug and alcohol education projects and programmes supporting young people to make safe choices about drugs. In particular to:
 - a. Plan, deliver and evaluate drug and alcohol education sessions for young people
 - b. Plan, deliver and evaluate training for school staff to deliver drugs awareness lessons
 - c. Support planning and delivery of drugs awareness workshops for parents/caregivers
2. Fully integrate equalities issues into all aspects of the work and where appropriate involve service users in the work of the Foundation
3. Be self-servicing in terms of all administration including document generation (Word, PowerPoint), accessing shared files, using online tools etc.
4. Undertake any other tasks as required by the Foundation which are commensurate with the level of the post.
