As the third sector interface (TSI) for Aberdeen City, we have over 20 years' experience working in Aberdeen as the central hub of knowledge relating to the local third sector which is made up of community groups, voluntary organisations, faith and equalities groups, charities, social enterprises, co-operatives, community interest companies, mutuals, housing associations and self-help groups.

Through our various strains of work we actively facilitate, support and promote volunteering; enable charitable organisations to develop and thrive through governance and funding support; represent the voice of Aberdeen's third sector at a local and national level; play a strategic role in third sector involvement with community planning, health and social care integration and in responding to local needs and outcomes; build capacity and provide platforms to celebrate and highlight achievements.

As well as working closely at a very local level with our partner organisations and the wider community, we also contribute to the national conversation as one of 32 TSIs which make up the TSI Scotland Network.

About the role

An exciting opportunity has arisen to join the Third Sector Interface (TSI) at Aberdeen Council of Voluntary Organisations (ACVO) as a Senior Development Officer, supporting the local implementation of The Promise and currently Fairer Futures work.

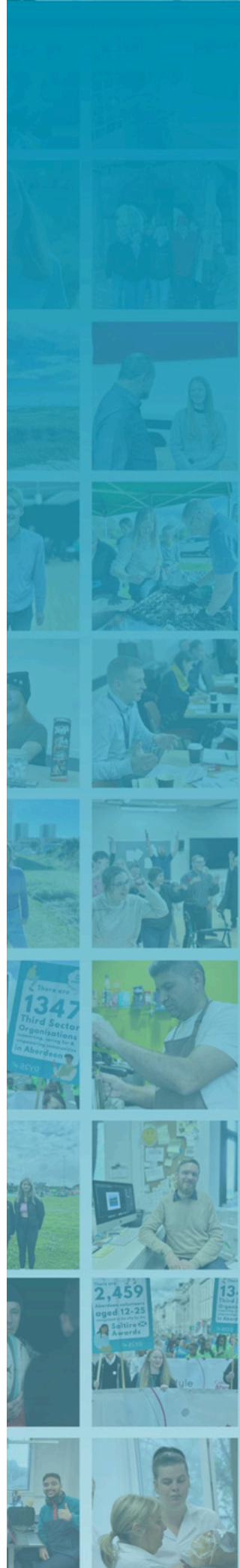
This role will play a key part in strengthening how third sector organisations across Aberdeen are connected, informed and involved at a strategic level.

Working closely with third sector partners and stakeholders, the postholder will support collaboration around emerging national and local developments, including a stronger focus on whole family support, early intervention and meaningful participation of care experienced people in shaping services. This will be achieved through facilitating events, coordinating learning and information sharing, and supporting the use of evidence and insight to better understand how Aberdeen is progressing collectively.

This is a chance to join a friendly and dynamic team and work alongside the third sector to turn the vision of The Promise into practical, measurable progress for children, young people and families across the city.

Job Purpose:

- To represent and promote the Third Sector at appropriate partnerships, groups and meetings, such as e.g. The Children's Services Board and the Carer's Strategy Implementation Group.

Job Description

Main Tasks

- In conjunction with other partners, ensure that the Third Sector can contribute effectively to Children's Services Planning and the Fairer Futures Partnership.
- To represent and promote the Third Sector at a strategic level and represent Third Sector issues at appropriate identified meetings.
- To ensure that Third Sector organisations are kept informed and given the opportunity to input into discussions, decisions, and new developments.
- To identify and support other organisations to input into and represent the Third Sector where appropriate.
- To ensure Third Sector organisations have knowledge of, and can engage with, the purpose of The Promise agenda locally.
- To plan and lead the local provider's forum and appropriate networks.
- To participate in regular team and staff meetings of ACVO.
- To ensure that all records relevant to the post are maintained accurately.
- Any other duties which may arise from time to time provided the tasks are both reasonable and within the post holder's capabilities.

Challenges & Demands of the Role

- Understanding and representing views of a diverse range of individuals and organisations, sometimes being the only Third Sector representative in the room.
- Maintaining good relationships and encouraging collaborative working between a diverse range of individuals and organisations.
- Supporting change in individuals and organisations
- Maintaining a good level of understanding across a range of issues around the Children, Young People and Families' agenda.
- Managing and prioritisation of multiple tasks associated with the role.
- Maintaining a positive and solution focused attitude at all times.

Knowledge, Skills & Experience

- An appropriate qualification in Community Work, Education, Social Work, Health or other relevant discipline.
- A working knowledge and understanding of Children's Services agendas and issues.
- A working knowledge of representation work.
- Experience of partnership working.

- Good IT skills.
